1. Get equipped.

Find a container to collect food scraps. Pick up a free compostable bag at any Ramsey County yard waste site or 24/7 food scraps drop-off site.

2. Collect food scraps.

Line your collection container with a compostable bag and fill with food scraps and other accepted items listed at [RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps](https://www.ramseyrecycles.com/foodscraps).

If using your own bag, be sure that it is marked with the compostable logo from the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) on the bag or the box.

3. Drop them off.

When your compostable bag is full, drop it off in a food scraps recycling dumpster at one of the collection sites in Ramsey County. Pick up a new free bag at the site.

Drop off your food scraps on a weekly basis to minimize odor and pests. Store filled compostable bags in the freezer until you're able to drop them off at a collection site.



What to collect.

Knowing what goes in your food scraps collection is important. If an item is not compostable, tossing it in your food scraps container contaminates the other contents.

ITEMS ACCEPTED

-  Breads, pasta & other grains.
-  Eggs & eggshells.
-  Coffee grounds & filters.
-  Fruit & vegetable scraps.
-  Dairy products.
-  Meat, seafood & bones.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

-  Diapers.
-  Plastic, metal, wood or glass.
-  Dog, cat or animal waste of any kind.
-  Plastic bags.
-  Grass, leaves or yard waste of any kind.
-  Trash & other non-compostable items.
